### Growers' Tip

Now with the festive season in the rear-view mirror and New Year personal resolutions at the fore, perhaps it is also time to take stock and make some orchid-resolutions. One in particular of which I have written about previously is on the subject of 'Regularity'. When I first started in orchids a very successful and worldrenowned orchid breeder and grower once told me that his key to success was, "that I never water my orchids". After seeing my puzzled look, he said, "go away and think about it". Have you got the cryptic answer? I should say like with crosswords, it's on the back page. Yes, every time he watered it contained fertilizer so in effect he only fertilized. Everyone will not be as dedicated as that, but it is the 'magic' that seems to be the elusive secret that many growers obsess over, and inevitably ask; "how do they grow their orchids so well?"

**Regular** fertilizer and **regular** cultural practices are all it takes to grow better orchids. Personally, as my memory dims; which I am assured is quite normal as age progresses, I have adopted the use of a small white-board

mounted in our garden shed to note the date of my fertilizer and spraying routines. These can be purchased from outlets such as Officeworks. I am sure you will be amazed as much as I was as to how long the periods actually are between applications. So, my orchid tip for the New Year is to become 'Regular'. © ©

#### **MONTHLY MEETING – ANNUAL COMPETITION RULES**

The monthly popular vote competition is divided into two groups.

#### **ADVANCED** and **NOVICE**

Upon joining the society, if you have had no experience in growing orchids – you will be placed in the novice group. If you have had extensive previous experience in orchid culture – you will be placed in the advanced group. The winner of the novice group each year will automatically advance to the advanced section. If you are still in the novice section after a period of 10 years membership you will also automatically advance to the advanced section. Plants are tabled in both the advanced and novice groups under the following sections:

#### **ADVANCED: SECTIONS**

CATTLEYA – OVER 100mm, CATTLEYA – UP TO 100mm, VANDACEOUS – OVER 65mm. VANDACEOUS – UP TO 65mm DENDROBIUM, ONCIDIINAE, PAPHIOPEDILUM, SPECIES (All Genera), PHALAENOPSIS, MISCELLANEOUS, CATASETINAE.

#### **NOVICE: SECTIONS**

CATTLEYA – OVER 100mm, CATTLEYA – UP TO 100mm, VANDACEOUS DENDROBIUM, SPECIES, (All Genera) ONCIDIINAE, MISCELLANEOUS.

Plants must be owned and grown by the member for at least <u>SIX MONTHS</u> prior to being tabled at a meeting. Each section requires a minimum of three plants, except in the miscellaneous section. In the event of a section not having three plants, then, if in any of the two Cattleya sections, or any of the two Vandaceous sections they are combined, in any other section they are moved to miscellaneous. On recommendation from the registrar and at the discretion of the Executive Committee, sections may be increased or altered to suit flowing orchids tabled.

POPULAR VOTE COMPETITION. A grower is awarded one point for tabling a plant or plants — on a popular vote by all members — a point is awarded to each winner in each section. The member with the greatest number of points for the year is the winner. In the event of a draw the grower with the greater number of plants tabled for the year shall be declared the winner.

#### JUDGES CHOICE COMPETITION

Judges will include all judges and associate judges present on the night who are willing to participate in a judging team led by the most senior or experienced judge in attendance. Each month the team will select three plants from all tabled (Advanced and Novice) as being the outstanding blooms of the night. The grower receiving the greatest number of points (1 per selected plant) for the year shall be declared the winner. In the event of a draw the grower with the greater number of plants tabled for the year shall be declared the winner.

#### COMPETITION PRIZES.

In winning a voting section or judge's choice at each monthly meeting, cash prizes of \$5-00 per popular vote winner and \$10-00 per Judges Choice will be presented at the annual Christmas function-presentation night held by the ROSI. A perpetual trophy as well as a smaller trophy to keep will be awarded to the winners of the advanced and novice popular vote competition and the member gaining the most points in the Judges choice competition during the year.

#### **OUTSTANDING ACHIEVEMENT TROPHY**

Competition for this trophy commences December 1<sup>st</sup> and closes November 30<sup>th</sup> of the following year.

This trophy is awarded to the member/owner of a plant receiving the highest award/points for an orchid. The highest award being an award from the AOC – STOCQ then followed by a ROSI club award. In the case where no plants had been awarded for the year then the trophy will go to the best prize winner of an orchid state conference/ROSI show in that order. In the case of a draw the trophy will be shared and also be presented at our annual Christmas/Presentation night. (The allocation of the trophy in this section may be changed pending a decision by the ROSI executive members.)

BEST ORCHID EXHIBITOR - ROSI - AUTUMN/SPRING SHOWS.

This trophy is awarded to the member who acquires the most points for plants exhibited at our combined two annual shows. Points are awarded as follows: 2pts for a first and 1pt for a second regardless of that plant attaining a major prize at the show.

#### NOTE:

To enter any of the above competitions you must be an active member of the ROSI and have attended a least (3) official functions of the ROSI. This includes monthly meetings, ROSI workshops or show.

Species of the Month



The species of the month this year is Oncidium (Trichocentrum) *lanceanum*. It is perhaps most recognized as the type species of the group of Oncidium colloquially known as the 'Mule Ear' varieties. Once seen the name becomes very apparent due to the shape of the leaves and in consideration of where it comes from , i.e. Central America and Northern South America, with the widespread use of mules present and past, it is quite an apt sobriquet. It can grow into a large specimen plant; however, it is easily divided by

nature of its rambling growth habit. The large leathery leaves make the orchid seem as if it has no pseudobulbs but these are very small stemming from the rhizome from which the leaf is attached. It can be difficult to keep it is its pot and, in my experience, it grows very well using slab culture. Portuguese cork is by far the superior medium, while seasoned hardwood slabs are also good hosts. It is a moderate feeder and likes a defined rest period during winter. The inflorescence that can hold up to 20 waxy



and perfumed flowers that appear in spring through to summer. It grows very well in CQ and worth having in your collection if not just for the pretty lavender/ purple and brown flowers, but also for its novelty shaped foliage.
