Congratulations are due to our President, our Executive and all the members of our Society who were involved. I thought the orchids and plants on display were spectacular. We certainly have some great growers within our Society, and the quality of the plants on show seems to get better every year. The Dinner on Saturday evening proved to be the usual happy and entertaining affair.

As usual it was great to welcome Alice and her orchids, and I am sure many of us added to our collections. Her happy, well grown plants prove to be irresistible to most of us. We all missed Stewie who is recovering from knee surgery. By all accounts he is recovering well and looking forward to going fishing when Alice returns home. Stewie, we send you a special cheerio from all our members. I spoke with Thomas Zierk (Stewie's son), who was assisting Alice at her Stall. He is a baker and recently worked at Chirn Park (near Southport) at Brumbys. Four months ago he moved north and is helping in the Nursery. They are very keen, enthusiastic gardeners and told me their plants are all doing very well. From what they told me I am sure their garden must be a joy to spend time in.

On 11th July Terry and I attended the funeral of one of our oldest and most respected members. Ken McDonald's funeral took place from St. Stephen's Church, Burnett Street. Ken was always an avid gardener and developed an interest in orchids in later life. He and Beryl joined the Orchid Society and won many prizes over the years.
