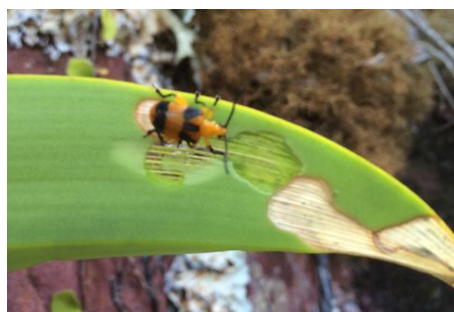
Remember to bring the usual - chair, plate of food to share for afternoon tea and hat. Donations to the raffle table are always welcome.

### **Dendrobium Beetle: (*Stethopachys Formosa*)**

At Saturday 29<sup>th</sup> February growers meeting which was held in Mary and Steve Gillott's beautiful gardens, grower's group coordinator Margaret Handley presented a talk on "Orchids in the Garden and Some Known Fragrant Orchids" and of course the bane of all orchids grown in the open, the dreaded Dendrobium Beetle was discussed. Margaret had photos of these for attendees to view. Following the rain they appear to be about in big numbers and are decimating outside orchids, and also the ones that slip inside greenhouses can wreck havoc on our collections. For those who are not sure of what the Dendrobium Beetle is like below are photos. I have also included a recipe for home made spray that discourages them landing on plants. Some growers use Diazonon for an instant kill of the grubs, followed by Confidor Pills to stop re-infection, then use Carbaryl Spray over leaves and blooms to stop the adult beetles eating them. I have also included an article by Hymn which was previously published in the July 2015 Newsletter.



## HOMEMADE DENDROBIUM BEETLE SPRAY

Mix 5 grams/mls of **PERMETTHRIN 25:75** (can be obtained from Nursery Outlets) to one litre of water and to this add about 8 drops of **EUCALYPTUS OIL** (can be obtained from supermarkets). After mixing decant into a plastic spray bottle and use as required. Spray onto entire plant, flowers and leaves about once a month or when needed. It costs around 60 cents per litre so is a very economical spray. Before each use remember to give the spray bottle a shake to mix the contents.

### ARTICLE FROM JULY 2015 ROSI NEWSLETTER - *Hymn*

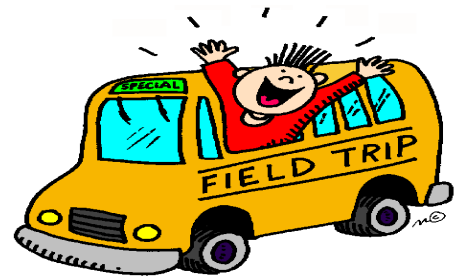
This pretty little beetle is one of the curses of the orchid grower, we have many pests that try to eat, suck and do other dastardly things to our babies. But the Dendrobium beetle is one you definitely don't want in your bush house. Some people say that they only like our Dendrobium Orchids but I have found over the years that they might have a preference for Dens but really aren't fussed too much what genera of orchid they eat. The female lays her eggs on the new growths or buds and flowers, but you will mostly find them on new growths and when the eggs hatch out in approximately 10 – 12 days, the larvae will then tunnel its way into the centre of the stem which will cause the whole stem to die back. They pupate in a white – waxy substance that resembles polystyrene, which is designed to protect the larvae until it becomes adult, this takes around 15 days.

The beetle is detectable by its gold stripe with a black band across the base and 3 black markings in the shoulder region. The larvae is a creamy colour short and dumpy and covered in a slimy goo, then when they advance in the stage towards adult hood they produce a whitish foam and are generally found at the base of your orchid.

They are then at their most destructive stage the adults will eat any flowers, and can decimate new growths as well as new leaves, this can happen in a very short space of time.

Control, first make sure your bush house is insect proof, I consider this is a must to boost your chances of having a grand champion. Some of the learned people will tell you that any spray suitable for beetles will bring about their demise but I have found the block A block B method to be the best. If you find one on a plant, place your hand beneath the beetle and try and grab the little sucker, if you miss him (or her), you'll find that they drop vertically and take it from me if they land on the mix or floor it's virtually impossible to find them. Hopefully they'll lob in your hand, you then decapitate them, *(or you can drop them in a bottle of metho.)*

## Species of the Month

The species of the month is *Dendrobium lasianthera*. It is one of the giants of the orchid world and possibly the tallest growing of all dendrobiums. It is found exclusively throughout our nearest neighbour, the island of New Guinea where it grows in the hot humid lowlands up to a maximum elevation of 300 meters. An indication of its love of humid conditions is that in extended wet seasons there are reports of it growing with its roots submerged for months without any apparent ill effects. It could be considered a 'first cousin' to our own 'lofty' Australian endemic Dendrobium, *Den. discolor*, which when unflowered are very hard to tell apart except for one obvious feature; *Den. discolor* is dwarfed by its northern relative which can grow to 3 metres.

Inflorescences range from 30cm to 60cm in length with an average flower count of 10 to 15, rarely up to 30 flowers. It is often described as a 'showy' orchid with colours of its 6-8cm sized flowers consisting of shades of brown mixed with lavenders and purples and a touch of gold in its lip. Valued for its twisted petals and glistening colour, a check with Orchidwiz shows its extensive breeding resume consists of 220 primary hybrids, and

926 progeny of which it is a part of their profile. It grows well here in Rocky especially with the high levels of humidity we are currently experiencing. Traditional mixes of bark, charcoal and rock will suit it best as a growing medium. However, as previously noted you will need a lot of space to cultivate it successfully because of its height, and most growers prefer to grow its primary hybrids such as, *Den. Bundy's Little Lassie* which results when crossed with *Den caniliculatum* for example; a cross that shortens it considerably and makes it much more manageable for greenhouse culture.
