












## Growers Group News

### Orchids of the month

For this month's newsletter I have included information on *Aeranthes grandiflora*. There was a plant of this genera tabled at our January meeting. Jenni Scott presented a lovely grown plant which received a Popular Vote.

#### Aeranthes grandiflora

Aeranthes grandiflora is an orchid species identified by Lindl. in 1824

Genus - Aeranthes

Grex – grandiflora (name currently accepted by Kew)

ORIGIN: A small to medium sized, hot growing epiphyte from Madagascar at altitudes up to 1200 meters in humid rainforests from the coast to the central plateau.

DESCRIPTION: A small to medium sized, hot growing epiphyte from Madagascar at altitudes up to 1200 meters in humid rainforests from the coast to the central plateau, with a very short stem and 5 to 7 distichous, narrowly oblong, coriaceous, unequally bilobed apically, broad leaves and has bizarre flowers that emerge in the late spring through summer from an axillary, 4 to 4' [10 to 120 cm] long, pendant spikes with sheaths covering the peduncle, and have 1 to 2, large, fragrant, long-lasting flowers at the apex. Never cut them off as they keep reblooming even if it seems dead.

FLOWER SIZE: 8 inches [20 cm] -- information provided by Jay Pfahl, author of the Internet Orchid Species Encyclopedia (IOSPE).



Another beautiful species was on show at our meeting, with two plants tabled in the novice section. A beautiful plant of Kerrie Clarke received popular vote in the species class.

#### Christensonia vietnamica

*Cristensonia vietnamica* is a small sized, renanthera like, climbing species. The flowers are about 1" in diameter and will last about two week.s

Haager 1993 (now Vanda R. Brown)

Pronunciation – criss-ten-SO-nee-ah

Tribe: Vandeae
Subtribe: Aeridinae
Distribution - Vietnam

It is interesting how some orchids must travel the globe to find their identity. It is even more unusual when it happens during our generation. This monotypic genus is represented only by *Christensonia vietnamica*. The plants were



discovered by the Czech botanist Jiri Haager during a geological expedition in southern Vietnam. The genus was created in 1993 and named after Eric Christenson in recognition for his work with Vandaceous orchids of the subtribe *Aeridinae*. While this species shares characteristics with both *Aerides* and *Rhynchostylis*, with the publication of *Genera Orchidacearum* volume 6, it is now included in the genus Vanda. Affected hybrid names are explained on this website. This is a lowland species found around 100m elevation and requires warm temperatures.

Michael Coronado of RF Orchids offers the cultural suggestions listed below.

#### --- CULTURE ---

Temperature:	Warm-growing	
Light:	Bright, dappled shade, slightly less than conditions for strap-leaved vandas and ascocendas.	
Water- Humidity: High humidity; water daily if mounted on cork, every other day if on treefer		
Fertilizer: High humidity; water daily if mounted on cork, every other day if on treef		
Potting:	Best mounted on tree fern or cork
