












Orchid of the month

This month I am covering the genus *Dendrobium sulcatum*. An exquisite flowering plant was benched at our November General Meeting that received both Judges Choice and Popular Vote achievements for Bob Jenkins & Shirley Kuhl.

Dendrobium sulcatum also called The Furrowed Lip Dendrobium, Callista sulcata, is a species of the genus Dendrobium. This species was described by John Lindley in 1838.

Dendrobium sulcatum is native to India and Southeast Asia, including Myanmar, China, northern Thailand, Laos, and Vietnam. In India, their natural habitats extend from the tropical valleys near Kalimpong and Darjeeling in Sikkim to the Khas Hiss (Khasia), Assam, Manipur and Megahalay. In north-eastern India, they grow at heights of 500-1000 metres.

It is a small to medium sized, warm

growing epiphyte, which reaching 20-45cm in height, that has flattened, 25cm long, clavate pseudobulbs carrying 2 apical, ovate, 10-20cm long leaves.

The Furrowed Lip Dendrobium blooms in the late spring on a short, pendulous inflorescence produced below the apical leaf and is not much longer with very short lived, fimbriate flowers. The flowers are 2.5 to 3.5cm in diameter and have a shape similar to bowls or bells. The flakes of both whorls may be bright or faded yellow or orange yellow with darker lines. The orange lip has red veins and brown or red-brown nerve veins on both sides at the base. The ruffle has a boat shape, it seems to be folded and has hairs along the banks. At the top, there are small, pincer-like appendages.



CARE & CULTURE

Cultural information should only be used as a guide and should be adapted to suit you. Your physical location, where you grow your plants, how much time you have to devote to their care, and many other factors, will need to be considered. Only then can you decide on the cultural methods that best suit you and your plants.

LIGHT

Dendrobium sulcatum needs a light level of 25000-35000 lux.

TEMPERATURE

The average summer temperature is 28-29 degrees Celsius, night 22 degrees Celsius, giving a daily difference of 7 degrees Celsius. The average temperature of the winter day is 21-27 degrees Celsius, the night 7-12 degrees Celsius, which gives a daily difference of 13-14 degrees Celsius.

HUMIDITY

For most of the year, The Furrowed Lip Dendrobium needs the humidity of 80-85%, but within 3 months at the end of winter it drops to 65-70%.

SUBSTRATE, GROWING MEDIA, AND REPOTTING

Dendrobium sulcatum can be grown mounted on tree-fern rootstocks or cork, with high humidity and watering in summer at least once a day. If they are grown in pots, any loose, fast-drying substrate is recommended. Repotting can be performed in any period as soon as new roots grow.

WATERING

During the growing season from Spring to early Autumn, the rainfall is abundant, but it is dry during the 2-3 winter months. In Spring and Summer, the plants should be constantly moist but not soaked, and when new growths reach maturity in Autumn, the amount of water should be gradually reduced.

HUMIDITY

Dendrobium polyanthum needs average humidity of almost 90% in summer but drops to 55-60% for almost the entire period of winter. In the spring, just before the beginning of the rainy season, the humidity for almost 2 months is only 40%.



MONTHLY MEETING – ANNUAL COMPETITION RULES

The monthly popular vote competition is divided into two groups: **ADVANCED** and **NOVICE**. Upon joining the society members can elect which group to enter. However, if you have minimal experience in orchid culture, you will be placed in the novice group (*default joining group*), if you have considerable-extensive experience in orchid culture you *may* be placed in the advanced group. The winner of the novice group each year will automatically advance to the advanced section. If you are still in the novice section after a period of 10 years continuous membership you will also automatically advance to the advanced section. Plants can be tabled in the advanced and novice groups under the following sections:

Plants must be owned and grown by the member for <u>at least six months</u> prior to being tabled at a meeting. Plants must be tabled by the owner of the plant/s (eg: - A & B Blogs – either of these people can table the plants- <u>BUT no proxy entries</u>). Each section requires a minimum of three plants, except in the miscellaneous section. In the event of a section not having three plants, then, if in any of the two Cattleya sections, or any of the two Vandaceous or Phalaenopsis sections they are combined, in any other section they are moved to miscellaneous. On recommendation from the Registrar and at the discretion of the Executive Committee, sections may be increased or altered to suit flowering orchids tabled.

POPULAR VOTE COMPETITION.

A grower is awarded **one point** for: – tabling a plant or plants; – on winning a popular vote from all attending members in each section. The member with the greatest number of points for the year is the winner. In the event of a draw the grower with the greater number of plants tabled for the year shall be declared the winner.

JUDGES CHOICE COMPETITION

Judges will include all judges and associate judges present on the day who are willing to participate in a Judging team led by the most senior or experienced judge in attendance. Each month the Judges will select three plants from all plants tabled (Advanced and Novice Sections) as being the outstanding blooms of the day and each plant will be awarded 1 Judges choice point. The grower receiving the greatest number of Judges choice points for the year shall be declared the winner. In the event of a draw the grower with the greater number of plants tabled for the year shall be declared the winner.

COMPETITION PRIZES.

In winning a voting section or judge's choice at each monthly meeting, cash prizes of \$5.00 per popular vote winner and \$10.00 per Judges choice will be presented at the annual ROSI Christmas function/presentation night. A perpetual trophy as well as a smaller trophy to keep will be awarded to the winners of the advanced and novice popular vote competition and the member gaining the most points in the Judges choice competition during the year.

OUTSTANDING ACHIEVEMENT TROPHY

Competition for this trophy commences December 1st and closes November 30th of the following year. This trophy is awarded to the member of a plant receiving the highest award/points for an orchid.

The highest award being an award from the AOC – STOCQ then followed by a ROSI club award. In the case where no plants had been awarded for the year then the trophy will go to the Grand Champion winner/s from that years' ROSI Shows. In the case of a draw the trophy will be shared between the winners. The trophy will be presented at our annual Christmas function/presentation night. (The allocation of the trophy in this section may be changed pending a decision by the ROSI executive members.)

CAVEAT: To enter any of the above competitions you must be an active (financial) member of the ROSI and have attended at least (3) official functions of the ROSI each calendar year. This includes monthly meetings, ROSI workshops or shows.






