


























Growers Group News

PRESIDENT'S NOTES ON FORTHCOMING EVENTS FOR 2023

2023 is going to be a very busy year for the Society. We will be holding our usual Autumn Show 15th and 16th April and Spring show 9th and 10th September. Frenchville Sports Club has put off the renovations of the conference areas until late September.

The ROSI tri-annual field weekend is now to be held on 4th & 5th March. With visits from the other CQ societies, planning is well underway. Final details will be published in the next newsletter. Currently venues for the various lunches and dinners have been booked. There will be a meet and greet to start proceedings off, a lunch on Saturday and a Dinner that night, then finishing with a lunch on the Sunday. Estimated cost to members for all meals with be around \$60 each. A club subsidy is yet to be decided upon. Separate costings for each meal will be available.

STOCQ Orchidfest Conference hosted by Hervey Bay Orchid Society. Our club is organising a 3-day coach trip down to the Conference departing Rockhampton on Friday 22nd September and returning on Sunday 24th. As this is school holidays and peak season in Hervey Bay, accommodation is at a premium. We must make bookings this far ahead to get accommodation.

We will not be registering for the Conference but attending the official presentation dinner on the Saturday night. We have had a quote on the Coach hire and the accommodation at the Ramada by Wyndham. It was very difficult to find some place that could accommodate the number of rooms we required. At present we have a holding booking on 25 twin share rooms at the Ramada. Presently costs for this weekend can only be an estimate and will depend on how many of our members participate. If we can get around 40 the costs will be around \$400 each. This cost is before the club decides on what amount of subsidy we will apply. The above would be for the Coach, 2 nights' accommodation with breakfast, the official dinner and entry into the Conference. The Coach will hold 50 so the more that come the cheaper the weekend will be.

I have given you the above information, so you have time to think on the events you want to attend. I will ask for an indication of numbers at next General Meeting so planning and organising of these events can go ahead. Orchid of the month

For this month's newsletter I have included information on *Dendrobium wassellii*. There was a plant of this variety tabled at our November meeting. Jeff Bloxsom presented a lovely grown plant which received a Judges Choice.

Dendrobium wassellii, (previous synonym - *Dockrillia wassellii*) commonly known as the **furrowed pencil orchid**, is a species of orchid endemic to a small area on Cape York Peninsula. It is an epiphytic or lithophytic orchid with branched stems, cylindrical, furrowed leaves and flowering stems with up to sixty crowded white flowers with a yellow labellum.

Dendrobium wassellii is an epiphytic orchid with creeping, branching stems 4–5 mm (0.16–0.20 in) thick. There are one or two hard, dull green leaves on the end of each branch. The leaf is more or less cylindrical, 5–12 mm (0.2–0.5 in) long and about 1 mm (0.039 in) wide with five furrows along its length. The flowering stems are 100–200 mm (4–8 in) long and bear between ten and sixty crowded, sparkling white flowers 14–18 mm (0.55–0.71 in) long and 15–20 mm (0.6–0.8 in) wide. The sepals and petals spread widely apart from each other with their tips turned outwards. The sepals are 10–14 mm (0.39–0.55 in) long, about 2 mm (0.079 in) wide and the petals are a slightly longer but narrower. The labellum is 10–12 mm (0.4–0.5 in) long, about 3 mm (0.1 in) wide, curved and yellow with purple markings. The labellum has three lobes, the side lobes erect and blunt and the middle lobe with wavy edges and three ridges along its midline. Flowering occurs from May to June.

Taxonomy and naming - *Dendrobium wassellii* was first formally described in 1963 by Stanley Thatcher Blake and the description was published in *Proceedings of the Royal Society of Queensland*. The specific epithet (*wassellii*) honors Joseph Leathom Wassell who collected insect and orchids on Cape York and sent them to the Royal Botanic Gardens Victoria, although it was not until ten years later when they were sent to the Queensland Herbarium and formally described.

Distribution and habitat -The furrowed pencil orchid grows near the top of rainforest trees, especially hoop pine (*Araucaria cunninghamii*) in the Iron and McIlwraith Ranges on Cape York Peninsula.



There were two awards granted this year by the Northern Panel of STOCQI. Firstly, Marg and Trevor Handley were awarded an AOC Award of Merit and that orchid also was awarded the STOCQ Award of Merit for their beautiful Cycnoches Arita 'Mervyn James'. Their plant attained 82.6 points overall.

The next plant awarded in October was Paphiopedilum Michael Koopowitz 'Krisett-Norma' owned by Jeff and Norma Glover. The plant had 2 inflorences with four flowers on each (3 + bud at the time of judging). It was awarded 83.6 points.

This plant achieved just enough points to give Jeff and Norma the Outstanding Achievement Award at our Christmas Awards dinner just pipping Trevor and Marg Handley.

Congratulations and a great effort by these two members and their beautifully grown plants.

This will be checked against other awarded similar plants and if eligible will be assessed by a panel of judges. 

















MONTHLY MEETING - ANNUAL COMPETITION RULES

The monthly popular vote competition is divided into two groups: ADVANCED and NOVICE. Upon joining the society members can elect which group to enter. However, if you have minimal experience in orchid culture you will be placed in the novice group (default joining group), if you have considerable-extensive experience in orchid culture you may be placed in the advanced group. The winner of the novice group each year will automatically advance to the advanced section. If you are still in the novice section after a period of 10 years membership you will also automatically advance to the advanced section. Plants are able to be tabled in the advanced and novice groups under the following sections:

ADVANCED SECTIONS

CATASETINAE
CATTLEYA – OVER 100mm
CATTLEYA – UP TO 100mm
DENDROBIUM

MISCELLANEOUS ONCIDIINAE PAPHIOPEDILUM PHALAENOPSIS VANDACEOUS – OVER 65mm VANDACEOUS – UP TO 65mm SPECIES (All Genera)

NOVICE SECTIONS

CATTLEYA – OVER 100mm CATTLEYA – UP TO 100mm PHALAENOPSIS DENDROBIUM MISCELLANEOUS ONCIDIINAE SPECIES (All Genera)
VANDACEOUS

Plants must be owned and grown by the member for <u>at least six months</u> prior to being tabled at a meeting. Each section requires a minimum of three plants, except in the miscellaneous section. In the event of a section not having three plants, then, if in any of the two Cattleya sections, or any of the two Vandaceous sections they are combined, in any other section they are moved to miscellaneous. On recommendation from the Registrar and at the discretion of the Executive Committee, sections may be increased or altered to suit flowing orchids tabled.

POPULAR VOTE COMPETITION.

A grower is awarded **one point** for: – tabling a plant or plants; – on winning a popular vote from all attending member in each section. The member with the greatest number of points for the year is the winner. In the event of a draw the grower with the greater number of plants tabled for the year shall be declared the winner.

JUDGES CHOICE COMPETITION

Judges will include all judges and associate judges present on the night who are willing to participate in a Judging team led by the most senior or experienced judge in attendance. Each month the Judges will select three plants from all tabled (Advanced and Novice) as being the outstanding blooms of the night and each plant will be awarded 1 Judges choice point. The grower receiving the greatest number of Judges choice points for the year shall be declared the winner. In the event of a draw the grower with the greater number of plants tabled for the year shall be declared the winner.

COMPETITION PRIZES.

In winning a voting section or judge's choice at each monthly meeting, cash prizes of \$5.00 per popular vote winner and \$10.00 per Judges choice will be presented at the annual Christmas function/presentation night held by the ROSI. A perpetual trophy as well as a smaller trophy to keep will be awarded to the winners of the advanced and novice popular vote competition and the member gaining the most points in the Judges choice competition during the year.

OUTSTANDING ACHIEVEMENT TROPHY

Competition for this trophy commences December 1st and closes November 30th of the following year. This trophy is awarded to the member of a plant receiving the highest award/points for an orchid.

The highest award being an award from the AOC – STOCQ then followed by a ROSI club award. In the case where no plants had been awarded for the year then the trophy will go to the Grand Champion winner/s from that years' ROSI Shows. In the case of a draw the trophy will be shared between the winners. The trophy will be presented at our annual Christmas function/presentation night. (The allocation of the trophy in this section may be changed pending a decision by the ROSI executive members.)

CAVEAT: To enter any of the above competitions you must be an active member of the ROSI and have attended a least (3) official functions of the ROSI each calendar year. This includes monthly meetings, ROSI workshops or shows.

Dendrobium Beetle: (Stethopachys formosa)

After the return of warmer weather and following rain a few weeks ago the bain of all orchids grown in the open, the dreaded Dendrobium Beetle has returned in droves to my garden. They are decimating my outside orchids, but also the ones that slip inside greenhouses can wreck havoc on our collections.

For those who are not sure of what the Dendrobium Beetle is like below are photos, it shows the adult beetles, damage they cause to leaves, a mating pair, the larvae that eat flowers/buds etc and the pupar stage, if you see white styroform looking masses at the base of your orchids it is possible that the larvae have eaten through the inner stem, eventually the stem will die.

I have also included a receipe for home made enviro spray that discourages them landing on plants. Some growers use Diazonon for an instant kill of the grubs, followed by Confidor Pills to stop re-infection, then use Carbaryl Spray over leaves and blooms to stop the adult beetles eating them.













HOME MADE DENDROBIUM BEETLE SPRAY

Mix 5 grams/mls of **PERMETTHRIN 25:75** (can be obtained from Nursery Outlets) to one litre of water and to this add about 8 drops of **EUCALYPTUS OIL** (can be obtained from supermarkets). After mixing decant into a plastic spray bottle and use as required. Spay onto entire plant, flowers and leaves about once a month or when needed. It costs around 60 cents per litre so is a very economical spray. Before each use remember to give the spray bottle a shake to mix the contents.
