Vale Fred Rosel by Jeff Glover

Fred Rosel, who was Rockhampton Orchid Society's oldest and longest serving member passed away recently aged 91. Fred had spent the last few years of his life in a nursing home in Brisbane where both of his daughters, Jenny & Julie, his only children resided. Many of our newer members from the last ten years may not remember or have known Fred; only seeing him at some of the Show Dinners when he was well enough to attend. However, Fred was a very active member of the Society in its early years. He joined in February 1962, a membership of over 60 years; a record connection to an organisation that would be hard for anyone to match. Throughout the years, he served in various executive and committee positions including as President for 2 years, 1989-90.

Fred loved orchids, and as he once told me, "Virtually any plant that grows ". He also had an extensive Bromeliad collection with many contemporary hybrids which he loved to collect and swap as he was well known in the 'plant world' especially throughout Queensland. Fred in conjunction with some other past ROSI members, once shared a Quarantine House. Before bio-security rules changed that required plants to be gassed, private collectors could import orchid plants and have them stored in a secure location; basically, a locked separate greenhouse. Here they were then visually inspected by Dept. of Primary Industries staff throughout the confinement period for pests and or disease. Thus, he was often amongst the first in Australia to have some of the latest hybrid orchids, especially those from the US. In those days, orchids were very expensive compared with the range of what is available today.

Being the avid collector that he was, Fred also had a collection of exotic birds which included breeding pairs of Macaws from South America valued at many thousands of dollars. In his working life Fred was involved in the motor industry working for many vehicle-businesses in Rockhampton throughout his career and eventually owning his own used-caryards. Fred was very generous with his knowledge and in helping many new collectors with gifts of plants and cuttings from his extensive garden. His place was always popular with visitors on inter-club field days, which he always made available for inspection on these occasions.

With Fred's passing another chapter in the Society's near 70-year-old story closes. Below is a picture taken at the Society's 60th celebration where Fred is shown helping cut the cake with President Jeff, and Marilyn Bloxsom, and Ellie (deceased) and Terry Dean, to whom the mantle of longest serving member now passes.
