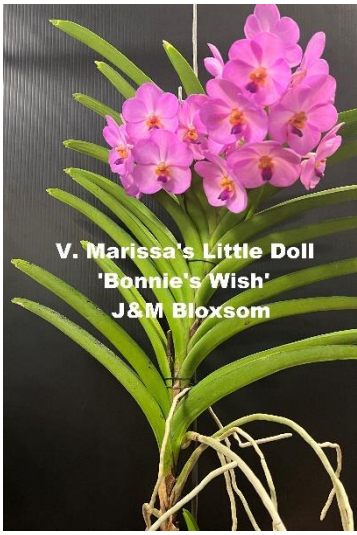

## *Orchid of the month*

This month I am covering the genus *Banfieldara* (*Bnfd.*). A beautiful flowering *Banfieldara* Gilded Tower 'Mystic Maze' grown by Rod & Miriam Black was tabled at our September General Meeting (photo above on left side) and received a popular vote award. *Banfieldara* (*Bnfd.*) Gilded Tower also recognized as *Brassicostele* (*Bcd.*) Gilded tower (*Brassicostele* Summit x *Brassidium* Gilded Urchin) produces bright, eye-catching green blooms! This popular hybrid orchid blooms have a life expectancy up to 1 month, the average plant height is 20" to 28". It is part of the Oncidiinae genera.

Bcd. Gilded Tower is composed of species of which 75% take cool temperatures, 75% take warm temperatures and 25% take hot temperatures. Grow this hybrid in cool to warm conditions, or 15°C to 24°C at night. It may be tolerant of hot (24°C to 29.5C) day temperatures. *Bcd.* Gilded Tower is composed of species of which 100% take medium light, 25% take low light and 25% take high light. Grow this hybrid in dappled light conditions. It may be tolerant of shaded and bright indirect light conditions.

You can repot in Sphagnum, but it keeps water and isn't good for some growers who are over-waterers.

If you're an under-waterer, then it's fine for the plant. Crinkled p-bulbs are normal on *Oncidium* alliance plants, and I wouldn't worry too much about that. If the roots look dead, you can cut them off for aesthetic reasons.

Recommend temperature at day time 18°C – 24°C at night time 10°C– 15°C, high humidity more than 50%, change old soil, cork soil, bark or bark chip, transparent pot, pot in that will be fit (not too big) room temperature water, clean water (rain water), when changing pot need to cut the dead roots, need to change cork before start to become compost and acid, recommend to use Styrofoam to give air for the root, drained soil
